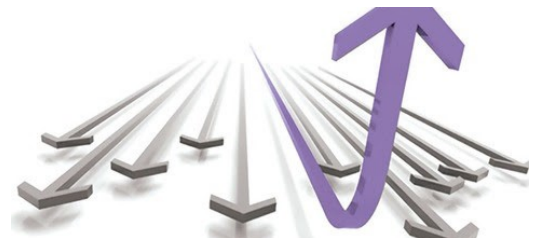
Enhancing Revenue Mobilization Systems in Liberia

Feasibility Study Paves Way for Georgia to Become Transport and Logistics Hub

PMCG, under a consortium led by Antea Netherland B.V., is working on a feasibility study and detailed design of the upgrading of the Rustavi – Red Bridge and Rustavi – Sadakhlo Roads. The roads have crucial importance, as they will be part of the East-West Highway project, which is a strategic project designed to transform Georgia into a transport and logistics hub for trade between Central Asia and the Far East, and Turkey and Europe.

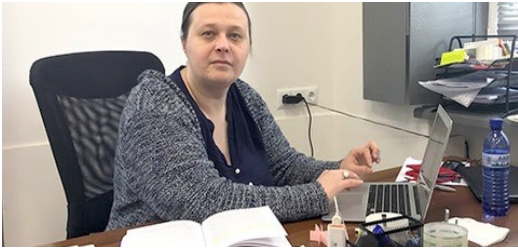

Corruption Perceptions Index 2016

On January 25, Transparency International published its Corruption Perceptions Index 2016. According to the Index, over two-thirds of the 176 countries assessed fall below the midpoint of the scale which ranges from 0 (highly corrupt) to 100 (very clean). As was the case in 2015, New Zealand and Denmark top the rankings with a score of 90. Georgia, with 57 points, occupies a leading position in Eastern Europe, improving by 5 points from last year.
